Reaffirming the principles of the 1945 United Nations Charter,

Recognizing the xxx,

Reiterating the Convention of XXXX,

Taking into consideration the efforts of XXX,

Deeply concerned with XXX,

Keeping in mind the state of XXX,

1. **Encourages** countries to held consultative meetings between the parties taking part in the conflict, sponsored by the United Nations, in order to try to reach a peaceful settlement of the dispute through dialogue and negotiations;
2. **Decides** to hold peace talks between the representatives of the Hadi government and the Houthis:
 - a. Representatives of Saudi Arabia, Iran, and United Arab Emirates will be invited as observers for the peace talks.
3. **Invites** the representatives of both parties to meet in Abuja, Nigeria in November 2019:





- a. **Reiterates** that the security of the delegations must be provided by the Nigerian government armed forces.
4. **Establishes** that religious minorities will continue to have their rights protected in Yemen under the legitimate government of president Hadi after the civil war;
5. **Also establishes** Yemen's compromise in incentive pacific coexistence between different sects of Islam and protect religious grounds of the most diverse Islam sects.
6. **Reinforces** the right to religious freedom for the Zaid sect, the official religious segments of most Houthis;
7. **Expresses** deep concern with deliberate attacks against civilians;
8. **Designates** the creation of an investigative group composed by 20 representatives of the Organisation for Islamic Cooperation:
 - a. The investigative group shall have access to the local of the bombing in order to search the place and look for clues;
 - b. Their security must be a top priority;
 - c. The investigative group shall report to the Secretary-General of OIC;
 - d. The group shall have up to 30 days, with the possibility of being extended for further 30 days, after the official visits to the site of the bombing to develop a final document on the attack;
 - e. Each representative shall be from a different country, not being permitted two or more representatives from the same nation.
9. **Emphasizes** our commitment to combating terrorism in the Muslim world and supporting international organizations, such as the United Nations Security Council, in this mission;
10. **Condemns** the Houthi rebellion in northern Yemen as a terrorist act, in the principle of Article 1 of the Convention on Combating International Terrorism. The Member States also **urge** the Secretary-General to condemn the Houthi rebellion as a terrorist act;
11. **Recognizes** that even though the Houthi rebellion is majority composed of people from the Zaid sect, this organization recognizes that the Zaidis and the Houthi rebellion are distinct, with the rebellion being characterized as a terrorist movement;
12. **Supports** the international military coalition and its acts, by recognizing Abdrabbuh Mansur Hadi as the legitimate President of the Republic of Yemen:
 - a. **Urges** the coalition to:
 - i. Re-establish the peace in Yemen;
 - ii. Train the Yemeni Armed Forces and the Yemeni police;





iii. Help the Yemeni government to protect itself from terrorism in the country.
